

Translational Neuropsychiatry Unit Affiliated PI (API)

A TNU Affiliated PI (API) is typically an AU researcher with a permanent position and with a close research collaboration with one or more TNU CORE PI (e.g. through joint grants/research centres, shared facilities, student supervision). The affiliation is expected to strengthen strategic infrastructures and research fields (or expertise) that are of key importance to TNU. The API should contribute to the TNU working environment by supporting integrated activities between the groups (TNU and the API), development of collaborative work and training/supervision of students and staff.

- The API should have qualifications and a position at associate professor level or higher, with distinguished productivity in the field of translational psychiatry.
- The appointment as API is for 5-year time period with reappointments based on a renewed expression of interest and approval.
- For projects associated with TNU, API has access to TNU research infrastructures (expertise and equipment) on similar terms as TNU CORE PIs.
- API can take part in all internal TNU communications and activities but is not involved in core decisions about the unit.
- Group members of API labs are free to participate in the weekly internal meetings and may participate by invitation to TNU-financed activities such as retreats and workshops.
- API can represent TNU on collaborative initiatives, such as international networks.
- API is expected to acknowledge TNU affiliation in communications on projects associated with TNU and publications resulting from them.
- The API should be willing to provide collaborative opportunities for TNU members in their own group.
